Re: RSHE lessons/meeting

Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to let you know that I will soon be teaching RSHE (Relationships, Sex and Health Education) in Year 3. I am planning to teach the majority of this on **Thursday 3rd and Friday 4th July**.

Through the teaching of the JIGSAW scheme of learning, alongside the school's RSHE Policy, and in line with the Government's new Relationship and Sex Education Curriculum, the **Year 3** coverage will focus on:

- Identifying differences between males and females that enable them to have babies,
- The life cycle of a human,
- How our bodies need to change, both on the inside and outside, so that we can make babies when we grow up,
- How babies grow in humans and animals
- How to feel safe and ask for help,
- Define meaning of public /private,
- Understanding family stereotypes with a focus on parenting and family roles.

It will be taught using age appropriate diagrams, animations and vocabulary and the pupils will have an opportunity to ask their own questions within gender groups where appropriate.
